Supplies for Beginners

What do you need to get started?

- Drawing Board something to tape your work on to support your work.
- Table Easel you might be happy without one but it's better to work up right or at an angle.
- Pastel Sticks a must. Have you got some already? They will do to get you going or check the places to buy student ranges below.
- Pastel Pencils a must. Have you got some already? They will do to get you going or check the places to buy below.
- Pan Pastels (optional) you don't need these to start
- Rubber Blender not essential to start
- Tortillon Blender a really good idea to have some of these, they are so useful.
- Kneadable Putty Rubber really useful
- Transfer Paper not needed for the Seascape Tutorial but if you lack drawing skills right now then get some so you don't need to worry about drawing skills when you're learning soft pastel skills.
- Pastel Paper If you have some already, try what you've got. But if you
 don't like the paper or it makes life hard for you, look at getting wet and dry
 paper or Pastelmat.
